Who can apply?


Researchers from all over the world can apply for a fellowship. You must have either a doctoral degree or at least 4 years' full-time research experience, after obtaining a degree permitting you to embark on a doctorate.

Fellowship schemes

At the date of application submission, the researcher must not have resided or carried out his/her main activity in the country of the host organisation for more than 12 months in the 3 years immediately prior to the application submission (=transnational mobility).

From EU Member States or Associated Countries or Third Countries to Switzerland or EU Member States.

Outgoing

From an EU Member State or an Associate Country in another EU Member State, Associate Country or Third Country. Outgoing mobility for a stay in a Third Country should be coupled to a return phase to a EU Member State or Associated Country.

Reintegration

EU Member State or Associated Country residents having carried out research in a Third Country for at least the last 3 years and who wish to take up a research position within the EU Member States or Associated Countries.

Training certification

The fellows in the programme have the opportunity to obtain a certification comprised to a workload of 180 hours.
